Updates in the Field

Today's Heroin Epidemic-CDC Heroin use has increased across the US among men and women, most age groups, and all income levels. Some of the greatest increases occurred in demographic groups with historically low rates of heroin use: women, the privately insured, and people with higher incomes. Not only are people using heroin, they are also abusing multiple other substances, especially cocaine and prescription opioid painkillers. As heroin use has increased, so have heroin-related overdose deaths. Between 2002 and 2013, the rate of heroin-related overdose deaths nearly quadrupled, and more than 8,200 people died in 2013. States play a central role in prevention, treatment, and recovery efforts for this growing epidemic.

States can:

- Address the strongest risk factor for heroin addiction: addiction to prescription opioid painkillers.
- Increase access to substance abuse treatment services, including Medication-Assisted Treatment (MAT), for opioid addiction.
- Expand access to and training for administering naloxone to reduce opioid overdose deaths.
- Ensure that people have access to integrated prevention services, including access to sterile injection equipment from a reliable source, as allowed by local policy.
- Help local jurisdictions to put these effective practices to work in communities where drug addiction is common.

Did you know...

With antidepressants and alcohol both slow down the central nervous system, affecting the brain - impairing thinking skills and alertness sooner.

Did You know...

Drinking can be harmful when taking certain over-the-counter and prescription pain relievers because alcohol intensifies the effect of some pain medicines. It's generally safe to drink in small amounts if you're taking acetaminophen (Tylenol), but that chronic drinking and acetaminophen use can cause liver damage.

Policy Updates

- In the General Assembly of North Carolina Session 2015 three bills were passed related to palcohol. Palcohol is freeze-dried vodka, rum, "powderitas" and other drinks that can be added to water to make an alcoholic beverage.
 - House Bill 290—Prohibits the sale, possession, or consumption of powdered alcohol and clarifies that the Administrative Procedure Act applies to certain actions taken by the ABC Commission.
 - House Bill 707-Prohibits the sale, possession, or consumption of powdered alcohol.
 - House Bill 909-Makes various changes to the alcoholic beverage control commission laws; prohibits the sale, possession, or consumption of powdered alcohol.


